## **BED BUGS PREP SHEET**

Preparation of a room for treatment is essential to the successful management of bed bugs. Most pest managers prefer to conduct as inspection BEFORE any cleaning or rearranging has occurred. This gives pest manager a sense of full extent of the problem and prevent disturbance and spread of bed bugs before treatment. However once bed bugs are located and the size of the problem has been estimated, room preparation must be done, and usually by the resident. Some clients may need help and the pest control professional or building management must be sensitive to this.

## Suggested room preparation steps include:

	All Electronics must be unplugged.
□ bags fo	Empty drawers and closets and place belongings into plastic bags. Place all clothing and coats into transport to the laundry. Shoes, pillows, and children's plush toys should be bagged for the laundry.
□ inspecti	Plastic toys, books, electronics, and anything that cannot be washed should be bagged for on.
□ pillows	The room should be empty of all cloth and plush items, except plush furniture. If possible, the of plush furniture should be removed and laundered.
	Move Furniture at least 18 inches away from the walls. People may need help with this.
	Remove outlet covers and switch plates on all walls.
□ reenteri	People and pets must leave the area during treatment and wait the stated amount of time before ng, usually 4 hours.
□ very se	If there is a fish tank in the household, it should be covered with a towel or plastic, because fish are nsitive to many pesticides
□ basebo	Make sure the pest control professional can get to all furniture, closets, sinks, beds, and ards to inspect and treat
